Business Interruption Insurance - Advocate for Yourself

Business Interruption insurance normally covers the replacement of lost income when operations are halted during a natural disaster such as a fire. It covers operating expenses, a move to a temporary location, payroll, taxes and loan payments. The Coronavirus pandemic is uncharted territory and until we know more about what insurances companies should cover, here are some steps to advocate for yourself:

1. Ask your agent to file a claim with the carrier even if they tell you that your business is not covered.
2. When you receive the declination document, write a letter to the carrier and tell them why you are disputing the declination (be specific)
3. If declined again, connect with an independent insurance specialist and see if the next step should be to file a request for help at the Colorado Division of Insurance

IRS Extends Filing Period to July 15

The IRS is extending the federal income tax filing deadline to July 15 as part of a growing effort to stem the financial pain from the coronavirus pandemic - announced Treasury Secretary Steven Mnuchin today. - The news has been verified via multiple news agencies. The IRS site has not been updated. Secretary Mnuchin urged those getting a return to file now to receive their return as soon as possible.

Loans & Grants

Colorado COVID-19 Relief Fund Grants

The Colorado COVID Relief Fund's purpose is to raise and coordinate allocation of funds based on prevention, impact and recovery needs of community-based organizations in Colorado. This Fund is organized to ensure that the most acute community needs across the state are being addressed and that community voice is reflected in all funding decisions made over time.

COVID-19 CO Creatives Relief Grant

The COVID-19 CO Creatives Relief Grant is a one-time payment to non-profit arts organizations in Colorado with an annual operating budget of less than \$1 million. These grants are dependent on available funds. All grants are for general operating support. Priority will be given to small and mid-size organizations, particularly those working in underserved communities. Grant funds need to be expended by December 31, 2020. The award amounts will be based on the organization's cash operating revenue for the most recently completed fiscal year.

El Pomar Assistance Fund

El Pomar Foundation announced the establishment of the Colorado Assistance Fund (CAF). CAF is a \$1 million fund offering immediate aid to nonprofit organizations supporting Colorado communities, organizations and individuals affected by the recent outbreak of COVID-19.

Facebook Small Business Grants Program

Facebook announced a \$100 million program to help small businesses as governments throughout the country urge gyms and restaurants to close their doors to slow the coronavirus pandemic.

JP Morgan Chase Assistance to Small Businesses

JPMorgan Chase announced a \$50 million global philanthropic commitment to address the immediate public health and long-term economic challenges from the COVID-19 global pandemic. \$8 million to assist small businesses vulnerable to significant economic hardships in the U.S., China and Europe.

Kiva Loans

The nonprofit organization Kiva provides 0% interest loans to small businesses worldwide. They are expanding eligibility and the amount of loans provided during this crisis.

Verizon Small Business Recovery Fund

Thanks to a \$2.5 million investment from Verizon, LISC is offering grants to help small businesses fill urgent financial gaps until they can resume normal operations or until other more permanent financing becomes available.

Deadline-Specific Opportunities

LISC: Verizon Small Business Recovery Fund

Geographic Scope: United States

Application Deadline: April 4, 2020

LISC will use Verizon funding to provide grants of up to \$10,000 to businesses facing immediate financial pressure because of COVID-19—especially entrepreneurs of color, women-owned businesses and other enterprises in historically underserved communities who don't have access to flexible, affordable capital.

American Heart Association: AHA Rapid Response Grant

Geographic Scope: United States

Application Deadline: April 6, 2020

The AHA invites cardiovascular-focused applications that will contribute to understanding the cardiovascular and cerebrovascular pathogenesis, diagnosis, prevention, clinical manifestations, clinical management (including critical care management) and social behaviors which can lead to dissemination, containment, and complications of COVID-19.

LifeArc: Coronavirus (COVID-19) Therapeutics

Geographic Scope: Global

Application Deadline: April 6, 2020

LifeArc has made available an initial £10M for the identification of therapeutics that can be rapidly deployed to treat COVID-19. The aim is to run trials in patients during the current epidemic. It is anticipated that applications will be for funding to repurpose one or more drugs that are generic, already licensed, or are in late stage development for another indication.

Tegan and Sara Foundation: Community Grants

Geographic Scope: Canada and the United States

Application Deadline: April 6, 2020

Committed to uplifting the LGBTQ+ community, especially as current times have left queer people uniquely disadvantaged. Grants are provided to/for projects and initiatives meeting the needs of the LGBTQ+ community caused by COVID-19; youth creators, activists, and organizations; small nonprofits; projects that need starter funding to get off the ground, and initiatives that specifically benefit intersectionally marginalized groups, including LGBTQ+ people of color, trans communities, and rurally-based LGBTQ+ populations.

Emergency relief to New York City musicians whose freelance careers have been impacted. Eligible applicants include current residents of New York City whose primary source of income is music performance, with demonstrated loss of income as a result of cancellations.

Austin Community Foundation: All Together ATX

Geographic Scope: Austin, TX

Application Deadline: April 10, 2020

Area nonprofits should submit proposals for the work they are doing to provide assistance to those most negatively impacted by the suppression efforts for and the spread of COVID-19.

Dance/NYC: Coronavirus Dance Relief Fund

Geographic Scope: New York, NY

Application Deadlines: Organizations – April 10, 2020, Freelance Dancers – May 8, 2020

Provides support to New York City area freelance dance workers and dance making organizations.

The Fund will prioritize supporting communities most impacted by COVID-19 including African, Latina/o/x, Asian, Arab, and Native American (ALAANA), disabled, immigrant, and women-identifying artists, as well as those at high risk including elderly and immunosuppressed artists.

Partnership of Women

Geographic Scope: Henderson, KY

Application Deadline: April 10, 2020

Supporting Henderson County community organizations whose fundraising efforts have been hindered by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Resistance Labs: COVID SMS Program Incubation Grants

Geographic Scope: United States

Application Deadline: April 10, 2020

Resistance Labs is providing \$15,000 worth of mass data, SMS, and program consulting services to organizations responding to the COVID crisis. With the support of Resistance Labs, organizations can reach up to 100,000 contacts. The aim is to identify critical programs and services and help them scale their reach via text messaging.

Rodenberry Foundation: Rodenberry Prize

Geographic Scope: Global

Application Deadline: April 10, 2020

Kinkade Family Foundation: Emergency Grant for Curators

Supports curators developing projects that promote artwork of contemporary and experimental nature. The program will provide one one-time grant of up to \$5,000 for unexpected emergencies related to COVID-19.

Kinkade Family Foundation: Emergency Grants for Humanitarian Nonprofit Organizations

Geographic Scope: United States and US Territories

Application Deadline: April 12, 2020

Providing Emergency Grants for humanitarian nonprofit organizations that are supporting women, children, families or art initiatives. One-time grants of up to \$2,500 are provided for unexpected emergencies related to COVID-19.

Geographic Scope: Bexar County, TX

Application Deadline: April 14, 2020

Provides technical and professional development support for individual artists during the national pandemic - up to \$600.

Central Alabama Community Foundation: Community COVID-19 United Relief Fund

Geographic Scope: The River Region area of Central Alabama and the Wiregrass

Application Deadline: Applications will be accepted from April 1 to April 15, 2020.

Will support nonprofit emergency response and recovery efforts in the River Region area of Central Alabama and the Wiregrass. Grants will be awarded to 501(c)3 nonprofit organizations supporting basic needs or health and wellness efforts related to the COVID-19 emergency and its aftermath.

Austin Community Foundation: Stand With Austin

Geographic Scope: Austin, TX

Application Deadline: April 17, 2020

Area nonprofits should submit proposals for the work they are doing to provide assistance to individuals and small businesses most negatively impacted by the cancellation of SXSW.

City of Boston: Boston Artist Relief Fund

Geographic Scope: Boston, MA

Application Deadline: April 30, 2020

Will award grants of \$500 and \$1000 to individual artists who live in Boston whose creative practices and incomes are being adversely impacted by Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19).

4Culture: Cultural Relief Fund

Geographic Scope: King County, WA

Application Deadline: May 15, 2020

As closures, cancellations, and loss of work due to COVID-19 impact the King County cultural sector, our Cultural Relief Fund will distribute \$1 million over the coming months.

Colorado COVID Relief Fund

Geographic Scope: Colorado

Application Deadlines: April 4, April 18, May 2, May 16, and May 30, 2020

Goal is to raise and coordinate allocation of funds based on prevention, impact and recovery needs of community-based organizations in Colorado. Through this Fund, eligible community-based organizations in CO may receive general operating grant up to \$25,000.

MIT Solve: Health Security & Pandemics Challenge

Geographic Scope: Global

Application deadline: June 18, 2020

MIT Solve is seeking tech innovations that can slow and track the spread of an emerging outbreak, for example by improving individual hygiene, developing low-cost rapid diagnostics, analyzing data that informs decision making, and providing tools that protect health workers. Solve is also seeking solutions that focus on preventative and mitigation measures that strengthen access to affordable primary healthcare systems, enhance disease surveillance systems, and improve healthcare supply chains.

Facebook Journalism Project

Geographic Scope: US and Canada

Application Deadline: Applications will be accepted until \$1 million in grant payments has been awarded. The Facebook Journalism Project will offer a total of \$1 million in grants to support US and Canadian local news organizations covering the coronavirus.

US National

ConvertKit: The Creator Fund

Geographic Scope: United States

Provides financial assistance to active creators who are experiencing financial hardship due to COVID-19. The Fund covers medical, childcare, housing, or grocery needs.

Equal Sound Corona Relief Fund

Geographic Scope: United States

Provides direct financial assistance to musicians in the US who have lost work as a result of Corona-related event cancellations up to \$500 per gig.

Freelancers Union: Freelancers Relief Fund

Geographic Scope: United States

Will offer financial assistance of up to \$1,000 per freelance household in the US to cover lost income and essential expenses not covered by government relief programs, including food or food supplies, utility payments, and cash assistance to cover income loss. (Applications will open on April 2, 2020.)

MusiCares: COVID-19 Relief Fund

Geographic Scope: United States

Expanded services to include lost income due to the cancellation of scheduled gigs or performances due to Coronavirus/COVID-19 precautionary measures. Music industry professionals may apply for basic living assistance (rent or mortgage).

National Science Foundation: Rapid Response Research (RAPID)

Geographic Scope: United States

Accepting proposals to conduct non-medical, non-clinical-care research that can be used immediately to explore how to model and understand the spread of COVID-19, to inform and educate about the science of virus transmission and prevention, and to encourage the development of processes and actions to address this global challenge. Researchers may use the Rapid Response Research (RAPID) funding mechanism to submit requests up to \$200,000 and up to one year in duration.

Peace Development Fund: De Colores Rapid Response Fund

Geographic Scope: United States

Designed for strategic intervention in movement moments like this, offers grants of \$500 to \$1,000 to grassroots organizations working to make positive community interventions through strategic, organizing-focused approaches, especially in marginalized communities of color and working class communities.

Will Rogers Motion Picture Pioneers Foundation: COVID-19 Emergency Grant

Geographic Scope: United States

Aims to assist individuals who work in theatrical exhibition. In order to be eligible, individuals must have worked in theatrical exhibition for a minimum of five years, derive their primary source of income from the movie theater circuit, and have been furloughed or laid off.

Albuquerque Community Foundation: Emergency Action Fund

Geographic Scope: Greater Albuquerque area

Supports nonprofit organizations in the Greater Albuquerque area struggling with lost and non-recoverable revenue expenses due to COVID-19. All grants are unrestricted and will range from \$500 to \$5,000.

Allegany Franciscan Ministries: Coronavirus Relief and Recovery Fund

Geographic Scope: Palm Beach, Martin, and St. Lucie, FL

Provides support to nonprofit organizations providing services to Palm Beach, Martin County, and St. Lucie county residents. Funding priorities include: emergency food, shelter, and other basic needs; expansion of service capacity related to increased demand for direct services; access to healthcare services for uninsured and underinsured clients; and technology and other resources to allow an organization to continue to provide services.

Amarillo Area Foundation and The Don and Sybil Harrington Foundation: Panhandle Disaster Relief Fund

Geographic Scope: The Texas Panhandle

Emergency grants will be funded through the AAF Panhandle Disaster Relief Fund for requests that will meet critical needs. Funding priorities at this time are programs providing food for high-risk populations, direct healthcare services, programs providing childcare for essential workers, and programs designed to diminish the risk of exposure to the virus.

Amazon: Small Business Relief Fund

Geographic Scope: Seattle (South Lake Union and Regrade neighborhoods), WA

Aims to help neighborhood small businesses maintain their livelihood, and continue to foster a vibrant community. To be eligible for a grant, recipients must have fewer than 50 employees or less than \$7 million in annual revenue.

Ann Arbor Area Community Foundation: Short-Term Cash Flow Program

Geographic Scope: Ann Arbor area, Michigan

Makes short-term (up to 180 days) cash flow loans of \$5,000 - \$50,000. This program has been initiated as part of AAACF's philanthropic response to the COVID-19 health pandemic and economic crisis and complements AAACF's grantmaking to support COVID-19 response, relief, and recovery efforts.

Arizona Community Foundation: COVID-19 Community Response Fund

Geographic Scope: Arizona

Provides immediate relief to nonprofit organizations in Arizona facing an increased demand for services from clients and communities as a result of the COVID-19 outbreak. Once the state of emergency has expired, any remaining funds will support nonprofit organizations impacted by COVID-19 financially as a result of program disruptions or cancellations resulting in revenue loss.

Arkansas Community Foundation: COVID-19 Relief Fund

Geographic Scope: Arkansas

Provides \$1,000 mini-grants to organizations that are supporting immediate COVID-19 response. Nonprofits, schools, churches, hospitals, & government agencies are eligible.

Artist Trust: COVID-19 Artist Trust Relief Fund

Geographic Scope: Washington

Provides rapid response grants supporting critical needs of artists in Washington State whose livelihoods are impacted by COVID-19.

Arts Council of Greater New Haven: New Haven Creative Sector Relief Fund

Geographic Scope: New Haven, CT

Will distribute immediate financial assistance to individual creatives and arts institutions most impacted by the Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19). Applicants can apply on a rolling basis to receive up to \$1,000 based on their financial situation, with a priority for low-income individuals and small-budget arts organizations.

Berrien Community Foundation: Emergency Response and Recovery Grant

Geographic Scope: Berrien, Cass, and Van Buren counties, MI

Support for organizations that are serving those affected by the COVID-19 outbreak. Grants will focus on those programs doing emergency relief, such as food pantries, child and baby needs, needs for shelters, and help for homebound seniors.

Boston Singer's Relief Fund

Geographic Scope: New England region of the United States

Supports New England-based singers whose classical performances were cancelled due to concerns over COVID-19.

Brandywine Health Foundation: Healthcare and Economic Relief Fund

Geographic Scope: Greater Coatesville area, PA

Will provide flexible resources to nonprofit organizations in the Greater Coatesville area serving the Coatesville Area School District geographic area including: City of Coatesville, Boroughs of Modena and South Coatesville, and the Townships of Caln, East Fallowfield, Sadsbury, Valley, West Brandywine, and West Caln. The Fund is designed to complement the work of public health, human service, and community economic development initiatives and the continuation or augmentation of services negatively impacted by all aspects of the outbreak as efficiently as possible.

Brooklyn Community Foundation: Brooklyn COVID-19 Response Fund

Geographic Scope: Brooklyn, NY

Will provide grants of up to \$10,000 in the following priority areas: anti-stigma efforts to address anti-Asian harassment and discrimination, prevention measures (education, sanitary supplies) for vulnerable populations, practical needs in case of disruption in services to vulnerable populations, food access and practical supports, and support for workers to address lack of access to healthcare and paid sick leave, lack of proper safety equipment, and the economic impact of lost wages.

Cambridge Community Foundation

Geographic Scope: Cambridge, MA

Launched two emergency funds to help families and individuals deal with the impact of COVID-19. The Cambridge COVID-19 Emergency Fund is available to individuals, small businesses, and nonprofits working directly with low-income populations. The Cambridge Artist Relief Fund supports artists and arts and cultural organizations facing a financial crisis.

City and County of Denver: Small Business Emergency Relief Program

Geographic Scope: Denver, CO

Working on connecting the Denver business community to the most appropriate resources in the region. The first step is to describe the impact by filling out a questionnaire.

City and County of San Francisco: COVID-19 Small Business Resiliency Fund

Geographic Scope: City and County of San Francisco, CA

Allows impacted business owners to access up to \$10,000 for employee salaries & rent.

City of Chicago: Chicago Small Business Resiliency Fund

Geographic Scope: Chicago, IL

The City of Chicago is establishing a \$100 million Chicago Small Business Resiliency Fund, which will help to provide small businesses with emergency cash flow during this immediate health crisis. Funds will be provided to eligible businesses as low-interest loans.

City of Los Angeles: Small Business Emergency Microloan Program

Geographic Scope: City of Los Angeles, CA

The Small Business Emergency Microloan Program provides financing needed to strengthen small business enterprises in this time of acute need that have been affected by COVID-19.

City of New York: New York City Employee Retention Grant Program

Geographic Scope: New York City, NY

The Employee Retention Grant Program aims to help small businesses retain employees as they face decreased revenue as a result of COVID-19. This program is available to New York City businesses with one to four employees that can demonstrate at least a 25% decrease in revenue as a result of COVID-19. Eligible businesses will receive a grant covering up to 40% of their payroll for two months, for up to \$27,000.

City of San Diego: Small Business Relief Fund

Geographic Scope: The City of San Diego and the City of Chula Vista, CA

To help businesses be resilient amid the economic challenges of the COVID-19 global pandemic, the City of San Diego has established a Small Business Relief Fund to provide grants, loans, and other resources to businesses located in the City of San Diego and the City of Chula Vista. This fund is designed to provide economic relief + support job retention.

Cleveland Foundation: Greater Cleveland COVID-19 Rapid Response Fund

Geographic Scope: Cleveland, Ohio

The Cleveland Foundation's COVID-19 Rapid Response Fund deploys resources to nonprofit organizations serving on the frontlines of the pandemic in Cuyahoga, Lake and Geauga counties. Funding is provided to address the urgent health, basic human services and economic needs of disproportionately impacted communities and individuals.

Coastal Community Foundation of South Carolina: COVID-19 Relief & Recovery Fund

Geographic Scope: Beaufort, Berkeley, Charleston, Colleton, Dorchester, Georgetown, Hampton, and Horry counties, South Carolina

The COVID-19 Relief & Recovery Fund will provide flexible resources to organizations in our region working with priority groups, including senior citizens, children, health-compromised, and workers in the hospitality and tourism industry in our service area of Beaufort, Berkeley, Charleston, Colleton, Dorchester, Georgetown, Hampton and Horry counties.

Community Foundation of Greater Flint and United Way of Genesee County: Greater Flint Urgent Relief Fund

Geographic Scope: Genesee County, MI

The Greater Flint Urgent Relief Fund will award grants on a regular basis to nonprofits addressing gaps that are surfacing in key services for vulnerable community members.

Community Foundation of Greater Memphis: Mid-South COVID-19 Regional Response Fund

Geographic Scope: West Tennessee, eastern Arkansas, and northern Mississippi

The Mid-South COVID-19 Regional Response Fund provides flexible funding to organizations serving community members who have been impacted by novel coronavirus and the economic consequences of the pandemic in West Tennessee, eastern Arkansas, and northern Mississippi. In order to move resources quickly and not further burden organizations on the frontlines of the pandemic, the Foundation is not hosting a formal application process at this time. Nonprofit organizations can fill out a survey to give the Foundation an understanding of what they are seeing in the community.

Community Foundation of North Central Wisconsin: COVID-19 Community Response Fund

Geographic Scope: North Central Wisconsin

Will provide flexible funding for organizations working in the Foundation's community who are disproportionately impacted by the coronavirus and the economic consequences of the outbreak. This Fund is designed to expand local capacity to address the effects on individuals and families as a result of the outbreak as efficiently as possible.

Community Foundation of Northern Colorado: Northern Colorado COVID-19 Response Fund

Geographic Scope: Larimer County, Colorado

Will be distributed to nonprofit organizations throughout Larimer County through the course of the crisis. The goal is to move resources quickly and adapt to evolving needs.

Community Foundation of Marquette County: COVID-19 Community Response Fund

Geographic Scope: Marquette County, MI

Through this Fund, we are accepting requests for short-term funding to support operations of organizations that are struggling with immediate lost revenue and non-recoverable expenses due to COVID-19.

Community Foundation of Orange and Sullivan: COVID-19 Response Fund

Geographic Scope: Orange and Sullivan counties, NY

Aims to address immediate and longer-term needs of residents in Orange and Sullivan counties. The Fund will issue grants to established nonprofit organizations that provide front-line services to the most vulnerable populations – food for the neediest families and essentials, such as prescription drug deliveries to homebound senior citizens and people with compromised immune systems.

Community Foundation of Tampa Bay: COVID-19 Nonprofit Needs

Geographic Scope: The Five-County Region of Tampa Bay, FL

Not a competitive grant process. It is an innovative way to share specific needs with the Foundation, their fundholders, as well as other philanthropists in the Tampa Bay community. After completing the simplified Nonprofit Needs Request Form, the organization's needs will be included within a database of requests from the community. If the nonprofit's request is matched with a donation, the Foundation will notify the organization and transmit funds to address the request as quickly as possible.

Geographic Scope: Central and Southern Missouri

Awards grants on an ongoing basis to agencies across the Foundation's 58-county service area of central and southern Missouri. Current grantmaking priorities are for programs that serve vulnerable populations affected by the COVID-19 outbreak.

Community Foundation for Greater Richmond: Central Virginia COVID-19 Response Fund

Geographic Scope: Central Virginia

Aims to address the most immediate urgent needs, as well as the longer-term effects of the pandemic and community recovery in Central Virginia. Funding priorities include organizations providing crisis response services, organizations who are experiencing a greater demand for current services due to the pandemic, and organizations who are experiencing hardship due to loss of revenue.

Community Foundation for Monterey County: COVID-19 Relief Fund

Geographic Scope: Monterey County, CA

Will award operating grants on an ongoing basis to nonprofit organizations and public agencies in Monterey County whose operations in support of vulnerable populations and those affected by the pandemic have been stressed by the outbreak.

Community Foundation for Palm Beach and Martin County: COVID-19 Response Fund

Geographic Scope: Palm Beach and Martin County, FL

Will strategically deploy resources to community-based organizations that are working with communities disproportionately impacted by the coronavirus outbreak.

Community Foundation for the Greater Capital Region: Capital Region Community COVID-19 Response Fund

Geographic Scope: Greater Capital Region, NY

Will provide flexible resources to nonprofit organizations working with local communities who are disproportionately impacted by coronavirus and the economic consequences of this outbreak. One-time operating grants will help fund frontline human services organizations that have deep roots in the community and strong experience working with vulnerable populations. Funding will be provided to organizations located and operating in Albany, Rensselaer, Saratoga and Schenectady Counties. The committee will also consider supporting nonprofits operating in the surrounding counties of Columbia, Fulton, Greene, Montgomery, Schoharie, Warren, and Washington. (In order to move resources quickly, the Foundation is not hosting a formal application process for the Fund. Interested organizations may email the Foundation.)

Community Foundation of Elmira-Corning and the Finger Lakes

Geographic Scope: Chemung, Schuyler, Steuben and Yates Counties, NY

Providing support to nonprofit organizations and individuals in response to COVID-19. Mini-grants of up to \$1,000 are available to assist nonprofit organizations with: costs associated with employees telecommuting (iPads, laptops); and video conferencing or virtual meeting platform subscriptions. Grants of up to \$250 per individual are available for creative community service, such as small businesses that incur additional expenses as a result of offering free food, books to start a virtual neighborhood read, and care packages for older friends and neighbors.

Community Foundation of Greater Dubuque: Disaster Recovery Fund/COVID-19 Response Fund

Geographic Scope: Dubuque region, IA

Community Foundation of Northern Virginia: COVID-19 Response Fund for Northern Virginia

Geographic Scope: Northern Virginia

Will award block operating grants to local nonprofits with deep roots in the community and strong experience working with the most vulnerable neighbors. (The Foundation is not implementing a formal application process at this time. Interested organizations may email the Foundation ensure the Foundation is aware of the organization's needs, both external and internal.)

Community Foundation of Southeastern Massachusetts: SouthCoast Emergency Response Fund

Geographic Scope: Southeastern Massachusetts

Will provide flexible resources to organizations that are working with communities at the intersection of being most vulnerable to the COVID-19 virus and most impacted by inequity.

Community Foundation of Western Massachusetts: COVID-19 Response Fund for the Pioneer Valley

Geographic Scope: Pioneer Valley region, MA

Will provide flexible resources to organizations that are working with communities at the intersection of being most vulnerable to the virus and most impacted by inequity. (In order to move resources quickly, the Foundation is not hosting a formal application process at this time. However, the Foundation does want to know how the crisis is affecting your organization and the constituencies you serve.)

Davie Community Foundation: Davie County COVID-19 Response Fund

Geographic Scope: Davie County, NC

Aims to help combat the immediate needs created by the coronavirus and support nonprofit organizations who find themselves on the front lines. Grant funds may be used for organizational capacity or direct services for the children and families they serve.

Interested organizations may contact the Foundation via email if they feel they meet the grant criteria.

East Tennessee Foundation: Neighbor to Neighbor Disaster Relief Fund

Geographic Scope: East Tennessee

Provides timely disaster grants to nonprofit organizations in the Foundation's region in East Tennessee. The Fund seeks to provide emergency funds to nonprofit organizations to meet some of the critical needs created by COVID-19.

Eau Claire Community Foundation: Quick Response Community Fund

Geographic Scope: *Eau Claire area, WI*

There is currently not an open application process for the Illinois COVID-19 Response Fund (ICRF), however, organizations can provide their information via a linked Google Form (see FAQs) and the Response Fund Team will provide updates as soon as they become available.

Indie Theater Fund: Rapid Relief Grants Due to COVID-19

Geographic Scope: New York, NY

Provides awards of up to \$500 to support the community, prioritizing the consortium of companies, venues, and individuals working in NYC independent theater (Off-Off-Broadway in theater houses of 99 seats or less), operating with budgets under \$250,000.

Kalamazoo Community Foundation: Community Urgent Relief Fund

Geographic Scope: Kalamazoo County, MI

The Community Urgent Relief Fund supports local nonprofits providing meals, shelter, childcare and other necessities for families and individuals impacted by COVID-19 in Kalamazoo County.

Kern County Community Foundation

Geographic Scope: Kern County and Tulare County, CA

Administering a number of funds to provide assistance to nonprofit organizations in Kern and Tulare counties that are impacted by the recent Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic.

League of Chicago Theatres: Chicago Theatre Workers Relief Fund

Geographic Scope: Chicago, IL

Intended to help replace lost income due to theatre closures. The Fund is available to all those who have had to stop work and are not getting paid, including those who were on contract, part-time employees, and those working on a stipend which was not paid.

MetroWest Health Foundation: COVID-19 Emergency Grants

Geographic Scope: MetroWest area of Massachusetts

Committed \$500,000 in emergency grant funding to address the COVID 19 pandemic. Grants of up to \$10,000 will go to agencies in the region that are directly responding to or mitigating the impact of the coronavirus and whose mission is consistent with foundation.

Michigan Economic Development Corporation: Michigan Small Business Relief Program

Geographic Scope: Michigan

Will provide up to \$20 million in support for small businesses negatively impacted by COVID-19. The funding is divided between \$10 million in small business grants and \$10 million in small business loans to support businesses facing drastic reductions in cash flow and the continued support of their workforce.

Midland Area Community Foundation: COVID-19 Response/Disaster Relief Grant

Geographic Scope: Midland County, MI

Available to nonprofit agencies, public schools, and government entities located in Midland County and can be used for nonprofit operations, supplies, and client assistance. Priority is given to agencies providing needed services for vulnerable populations most impacted by this pandemic.

Minnesota Disaster Recovery Fund for Coronavirus

Geographic Scope: Minnesota

Created to support community needs as a direct result of the coronavirus pandemic. Funding is provided for both short and long-term needs that arise within communities, due to coronavirus or future disasters that occur within the state of Minnesota.

NC Artists Relief Fund

Geographic Scope: North Carolina

Provides direct support to artists and arts presenters in North Carolina. Eligible applicants include musicians, visual artists, actors, DJ's, dancers, teaching artists, filmmakers, comedians, and other creative individuals and arts presenters who are experiencing widespread cancellations due to this global pandemic.

New York Community Trust: NYC COVID-19 Response & Impact Fund

Geographic Scope: New York City, NY

Created to aid nonprofit service providers struggling with the health and economic effects of the coronavirus. It will give grants and loans to NYC-based nonprofits that are trying to meet the new and urgent needs that are hitting the city. Priority will be given to nonprofits addressing essential healthcare and food insecurity as well as arts and culture.

North Georgia Community Foundation: Coronavirus (COVID-19) Relief Fund

Geographic Scope: North Georgia

Established to make strategic grants to nonprofits impacted by and serving those who are affected by the coronavirus (COVID-19). At this time the Foundation is not hosting a formal application process for the fund; interested organizations can email the president and CEO directly to inform her of the impact this virus is having on their organization and how they are serving those individuals or families who are being directly impacted at this time.

Northstar Church of the Arts: Durham Artist Relief Fund

Geographic Scope: Durham, NC

Supports artists and arts presenters in Durham who have been financially impacted by cancellations due to COVID-19, with priority given to BIPOC artists, transgender and nonbinary artists, and disabled artists.

OC Community Resilience Fund

Geographic Scope: Orange County, CA

Collaborative response by the Orange County philanthropic community seeking to strengthen and support community-based organizations who serve vulnerable communities most impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Funding supports community providers in the areas of community clinic operations, emergency grants to individuals, and community-based organization operations.

Otto Bremer Trust: Community Benefit Financial Company Emergency Fund

Geographic Scope: Minnesota, Montana, North Dakota, and Wisconsin

In response to COVID-19, the Otto Bremer Trust has established a \$50 million emergency fund through its Community Benefit Financial Company subsidiary to provide financial support to Minnesota, Wisconsin, North Dakota, and Montana nonprofits and other community organizations impacted by and responding to the pandemic. The fund will provide resources in the form of short-term loans, lines of credit, and emergency grants.

Pittsburgh Foundation: Emergency Action Fund

Geographic Scope: Allegheny, Westmoreland or Beaver Counties, PA

Will address the immediate and long-term impacts of COVID-19 by providing funding in four areas: operating support for small and mid-sized nonprofit organizations (annual budgets under \$5 million) serving communities with predominantly low-income households; organizations that manage emergency funds that provide direct financial assistance to individuals impacted by COVID-19; support for Federally Qualified Health Centers and other community health facilities; and small arts organizations (and individual artists) that have had to cancel productions.

Quad Cities Community Foundation: Quad Cities Disaster Recovery Fund

Geographic Scope: Scott and Rock Island Counties, IA

Provides support to organizations in Scott and Rock Island Counties after a disaster. Grants will be issued as part of the community's response to the COVID-19 pandemic to support the effort to "flatten the curve" of COVID-19 infections in these counties by helping the community follow public health recommendations, and helping address the financial impact of following those recommendations.

The Record Co.: Boston Music Maker Relief Fund

Geographic Scope: Boston, MA

Provides financial relief to Boston area music makers experiencing lost income as the result of performance cancellations related to COVID-19. Small grants of up to \$200 will be paid rapidly on a first come, first served basis to affected artists and groups.

Rhode Island Foundation: COVID-19 Response Fund Grants

Geographic Scope: Rhode Island

Available to Rhode Island nonprofit organizations at the forefront of COVID-19 response. Grants will be awarded to: support nonprofit organizations providing direct assistance to Rhode Islanders with financial need or demonstrable hardship resulting from COVID-19; and provide operating support to nonprofit organizations that are meeting community needs resulting from COVID-19, and are in financial distress.

Robin Hood Relief Fund

Geographic Scope: New York, NY

Will provide support to nonprofit organizations in two areas of relief response: general operating support to continue to run their organizations and provide services, and emergency cash assistance provided to individuals in need as identified by community partners.

San Diego Foundation: San Diego COVID-19 Community Response Fund

Geographic Scope: San Diego, CA

Will make emergency grants to nonprofit organizations that have deep roots and strong experience supporting impacted communities, particularly those that are disproportionately affected by this global pandemic and its economic consequences. Grant funding will focus on these critical areas: food security, other essential living expenses, emergent needs, rent and utility payment support, and interest-free loans for nonprofit organizations.

San Francisco Foundation: COVID-19 Emergency Response Fund

Geographic Scope: The five-county Bay Area (Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, San Francisco, and San Mateo), CA

Will make a limited number of one-time grants (\$3,000 – \$25,000) to nonprofits addressing the following four issue areas: racial bias, worker protection, homelessness and renter protection/housing security, and food security.

Santa Barbara Foundation: COVID-19 Response Grants

Geographic Scope: Santa Barbara County, CA

Grants are awarded to individuals and families experiencing financial need as well as to nonprofit organizations to meet increased service demand and ensure operational capacity and business continuity.

Silicon Valley Community Foundation: Regional Nonprofit Emergency Fund

Geographic Scope: The ten counties in the Bay Area region, including Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, Napa, San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, Solano, and Sonoma counties. Will be used to provide flexible operating support grants to nonprofit organizations serving one or more of the 10 counties in the San Francisco Bay Area region. Funding will support organizations that provide emergency-related services such as food, shelter, health, and mental health services to affected communities. Grants will also be awarded to nonprofits that have experienced unexpected costs due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Theatre Bay Area: COVID 19: Performing Arts Workers Relief Fund

Geographic Scope: San Francisco Bay Area, CA
Resource for performing arts workers who are facing a loss of income due to the ongoing COVID-19 crisis. "Performing arts workers" includes all aspects of performing arts including actors, administrators, box office/event staff, carpenters, dancers, designers, directors, musicians, playwrights, production team, singers, teaching artists, technicians, etc.

United Way of Indian River County: COVID-19 Community Response Fund

Geographic Scope: Indian River County, FL
Will provide flexible resources to organizations in the Indian River County region working with communities who are disproportionately impacted by COVID-19 and the economic consequences of this outbreak. One-time grants will fund organizations that have deep roots in community and strong experience working with under resourced residents, such as those without health insurance or access to paid sick leave, healthcare and hospitality workers, among others.

Geographic Scope: Palm Beach County and Martin County, FL
Will provide assistance to nonprofit organizations in Palm Beach County and Martin County whose staff, services, and clients have been impacted by this disaster.

United Way of Southeastern Michigan

Geographic Scope: Southeastern Michigan
Will rapidly deploy resources to community-based organizations that are offering emergency relief to families and individuals in need. The initial focus will be on rapid response in support of front-line agencies providing services to the most vulnerable populations.

United Way of Washtenaw County

Geographic Scope: Washtenaw County, MI
Supports local nonprofits and community groups working with populations impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic faced with immediate, emergent and unanticipated community needs.

William Caspar Graustein Memorial Fund

Geographic Scope: Connecticut

Offering immediate support to communities in Connecticut responding to current events related to COVID-19. Support could include crisis response that addresses the physical, social, emotional well-being, and safety of those most affected by racism and poverty.

Working Solutions: Oakland Small Business Emergency Grant Program

Geographic Scope: Oakland, CA

Will provide working capital grants of \$5,000 to small businesses in Oakland owned by very low-income individuals who have suffered financial loss due to the COVID-19 crisis. Grants can be used to cover costs such as rent and utilities, worker payroll, outstanding debts to vendors, and other operating costs.

International

Breakfast Club of Canada: COVID-19 Special Grants

Geographic Scope: Canada

Issuing special grants for community organizations and schools to help ensure children and families have access to food during the crisis.

British Business Bank: Coronavirus Business Interruption Loan Scheme

Geographic Scope: U.K.

Provides financial support to smaller businesses (SMEs) across the UK that are losing revenue, and seeing their cashflow disrupted, as a result of the COVID-19 outbreak.

Mozilla Open Source Support Program (MOSS): COVID-19 Solutions Fund

Geographic Scope: Global

Provides awards of up to \$50,000 each to open source technology projects which are responding to the COVID-19 pandemic in some way. Applications will be accepted for hardware (e.g., an open source ventilator), software (e.g., a platform that connects hospitals with people who have 3D printers who can print parts for that open source ventilator), as well as software that solves for secondary effects of COVID-19 (e.g., a browser plugin that combats COVID related misinformation).

National Geographic: COVID-19 Emergency Fund for Journalists

Geographic Scope: Global

Emergency fund for journalists all over the world who wish to cover COVID-19 within their own communities. The Fund will distribute support ranging from \$1,000 to \$8,000 for local coverage of the preparation, response, and impact of this global pandemic as seen through evidence-based reporting. Eligible applicants include writers, photographers, videographers, audio journalists, cartographers, filmmakers, and data visualization experts.

Peace First: COVID-19 Rapid Response Grants

Geographic Scope: Global

Rapid response coaching and grant process to help young people around the world lead projects that address community impacts of COVID-19, from providing meals to elderly neighbors to launching digital mental health campaigns to support youth feeling isolated. Rapid response grants are open to young people between the ages of 13-25 globally.

Pulitzer Center on Crisis Reporting: Coronavirus News Collaboration Challenge

Geographic Scope: Global

Seeking proposals that develop innovative approaches to reporting on the novel coronavirus crisis using collaboration among journalists and newsrooms across state lines or national borders. Priority is given to proposals that focus on systemic, under-reported issues underlying the coronavirus crisis; use data-driven or interdisciplinary approaches to reporting on coronavirus; and hold the powerful accountable. This opportunity is open to all newsrooms and independent journalists in the United States and abroad.

Soze Foundation: Artist + Activist Relief Fund

Geographic Scope: Global

Will support artists and activists whose work has been impacted by COVID-19. Grants of \$250 will be awarded on an ongoing basis.

Surrey Homelessness & Housing Society: Urgent Response to COVID-19 Call for Applications

Geographic Scope: Surrey, British Columbia, Canada

Providing funding to organizations for activities that manage the risk of contracting and spreading COVID-19 and implement preventative measures to support this population

Sweet Relief Musicians Fund: COVID-19 Fund

Geographic Scope: Global

Supports musicians and music industry workers affected by the Coronavirus. Funds raised will go towards medical expenses, lodging, clothing, food and other vital living expenses to those impacted due to sickness or loss of work. Except for retired or semi-retired older (ages 55+) musicians or industry workers, the applicant must have, or recently have had, a serious medical condition.

Vancouver Foundation: Community Response Fund

Geographic Scope: Vancouver, Canada

Will provide flexible operating grants to charities in regions most immediately impacted by COVID-19 that work to address the following priority areas: immediate needs of low-income populations, the economic impact of reduced and lost work within the charitable sector, the information needs of vulnerable community members, and mobilizing citizens to assist their vulnerable neighbors with the challenges they are facing from isolation.
